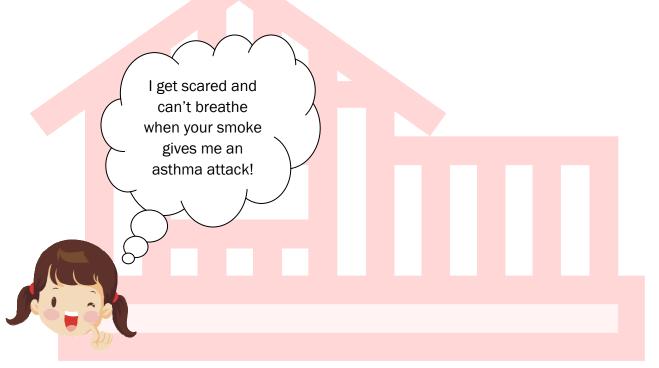

Tobacco Smoke Can Trigger an Asthma Attack

- ★ If you don't smoke but others around you do, you run a high risk of an asthma attack.
- If you have asthma, just the smell of tobacco smoke left in clothing and indoor furnishings can trigger an asthma attack.
- ★ If you have asthma, smoking is especially risky because of the damage it does to the lungs.
- If you smoke and have asthma, smoking can undo the effect of any controller medicine you're taking. You may end up having to take more medicine.

How To Protect Yourself and Your Children
