Outcomes



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Having a Data Strategy Allows Us To:

- Answer questions from Legislators, State leadership, potential SBHC operators, State Medicaid office, schools, community members...
- Justify existing funding
- Advocate for new funding
- Describe SBHC contribution to healthcare system
- Trend healthcare needs for youth
- Inform clinical practice, training and technical assistance
- Strengthen the SBHC story - provide data to support anecdotes

Guidance



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Lessons

- Consider the data points you need to tell the story of your SBHC program and how you can collect them
- Listen to SBHC: what information do providers need to make clinical decisions
- Communicate to the SBHC how their data is used and why it's important
- Data collection QI-
 - Review every data collection tool annually and make changes as needed to improve your data – especially with qualitative data
 - Review utilization data with SBHCs to make sure what you're collecting/they're reporting is accurate and troubleshoot discrepancies

State-level Implications

Recommendations

- Be patient, develop and make changes and improvements over time
- Consider the priorities of your funders, supporters and State. Make sure to include data points that are important to them
 - What are the priority areas of your State Strategic Plan
 - What questions have you gotten from Legislators, the Governor's office, Secretary of Health, or communities
- Share data and ideas with school partners and others
- Partner with or develop an evaluation team who can give you the tools you need to collect, analyze, and report data
